Gratitude is the word that comes to mind when I think of where we are today. We are where we are today because of YOU! Since March 2020 we have been challenged to shift and pivot our services in order to meet the basic needs of our community - which as you know, involved us expanding from an afterschool program at Bethany Covenant Church into two full-day learning centers. In December, with over 40 kids on our waiting list, our community truly stepped up. Through generous donations and a new partnership with the Skagit Valley YMCA, we were able to expand our Bethany site last month. We added three classrooms, hired five new team members, and welcomed 37 new children to COV for a total of 88 students getting daily academic and personal support each day.

It was a busy but rewarding day when we welcomed our new students into their new classrooms in January. The sentiment of the day was perfectly summed up by one of our new students when she said, "I love coming to COV because there is someone here to help me with my school work." This student hadn't even finished a full day at COV and had already felt the love, care, and support we provide for every child who walks through our doors.

Prior to starting at COV, the majority of our new students were at home, unsupervised, and left to navigate online learning alone. Many also faced additional barriers to academic success. Thank you for partnering with us and helping us provide a safe, caring space for each child to feel loved and get the support they need to thrive!

COV Site Updates



COV Bethany Site

In partnership with the Skagit Valley YMCA in January 2021, we were able to expand our services and open three additional classrooms for a total of six classrooms. We are currently serving 69 students at this site. All classrooms are following safety protocols which include daily health screenings, mask-wearing, and sanitization of equipment, technology, furniture, and restrooms. Sanitization is done multiple times throughout the day.



COV MVHS Site

In the fall of 2020, we partnered with the Mount Vernon School District to provide fulltime learning support on the Mount Vernon High School campus. We currently serve 16 students at the high school. Our goal is to create a similar program environment between our two sites by following our COV Cornerstones of Care which include providing academic assistance, enrichment activities, and social-emotional learning. Currently, our enrichment activities include STEM projects, girls' coding club, arts and crafts, and activities focused on social-emotional learning.

We are grateful for our partnership with the Mount Vernon School District and Mount Vernon High School because it has allowed us to care for 16 children-in-need with extended hours of 7am-6pm.



YMCA Partnership

We are beyond grateful for our community partnerships during this time. The Skagit Valley YMCA partnered with COV this new year in order to provide more childcare options for our community's most vulnerable children. We could not have opened three additional classrooms without this partnership. Thank you!

Meet Jesse

As the weather started getting cooler we noticed Jesse coming to COV cold and tired. He informed us that his family didn't have heat at home. COV was able to provide electrical blankets, along with warm clothing for them. The next day when Jesse arrived he mentioned that he slept so much better and the blankets that we gave him kept him really warm all night. At COV we not only support our students academically, but we also provide basic needs and personal support for each child and their family.





Meet Martha

The very first day Martha attended COV, she cried and didn't want to be there. When Martha opened up her Chromebook and entered her first Zoom session for the day, the COV teacher noticed that Martha had over 86 incomplete assignments. Martha had not been doing any assignments while at home. Our COV teacher knew what needed to be done. She met with Martha and explained why she was attending COV. She also helped Martha work through all of her missing assignments. Martha is now caught up at school and is able to finish her work each day at COV. She hasn't missed a day of COV since then and can't wait to come to COV every day!

Meet Sylvia

After weeks of attending our COV MVHS site we were told that transportation was becoming increasingly difficult for Sylvia's parents to provide since they both worked early in the morning. Removing Sylvia from the program was their only option. We realized that if Sylvia was not part of our program she would be unsupervised at home and would not have the support she needed to complete her school work. We were able to admit her at our Bethany site and arrange for transportation by our amazing group of volunteer van drivers to ensure she would be able to continue accessing her daily education.






COV Alumni Spotlight
