











Founded in 2006, Children of the Valley provides safe, compassionate, and enriching after-school support. In partnership with the Mount Vernon, Sedro-Woolley, Burlington-Edison, and Conway school districts, we serve students in grades K–8 who are referred by a teacher, counselor, or administrator for exhibiting significant academic or personal need.

Free to the families we serve, students receive daily instructor-led academic assistance, social-emotional learning, and enrichment activities. As they transition from elementary to middle school, students gain additional support through our after-school bike club. We also assist families in meeting basic needs to ensure every child has the opportunity to thrive.

COV serves under-resourced children and their families by valuing their cultural identity and empowering them through education, personal growth, and mentorship.



Cornerstones of Care

Our after-school program is built upon five cornerstones aimed at addressing the unique needs of the children we serve. These cornerstones of care include academic assistance, enrichment activities, social-emotional learning, family support, and mentorship. By participating in COV, children achieve academic gains, increased attendance and engagement at school, and increased confidence and compassion.





Academic Assistance

Through regular correspondence with teachers, we tailor efforts specific to each child's academic needs, helping them develop better study habits, increase skills and knowledge with an emphasis on literacy and math, and boost self confidence.





Enrichment Activities

COV strives to provide its children with a holistic, wholecircle approach to education which means opening the door to enrichment opportunities that may not be offered to them otherwise.





Social-Emotional Learning

A child's social-emotional well-being is one of the largest factors in their ability to learn. Our goal is to provide COV children with the necessary tools to understand and manage their unique, and often confusing, emotions.





Family Support

Our goal is to establish meaningful relationships with families to better understand how we can be of assistance. Whether it's through direct support or connecting COV families to community resources, we help families through any challenges that may arise in their lives.





Mentorship
